NORFOLK SPECIAL CRIMES DETECTIVE TO PRESENT KEYNOTE ADDRESS AT DAY OF UNITY – NIGHT OF REMEMBRANCE CANDLELIGHT MEMORIALIZING VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

The annual vigil was rescheduled from October 3 due to inclement weather

NORFOLK, VA - On Tuesday, October 25, 2022, from 6:30 – 8:00 p.m., the Slover Library in downtown Norfolk will host the *Day of Unity – Night of Remembrance Candlelight Vigil* to memorialize victims of domestic violence in Coastal Virginia. The event is free, and the public is encouraged to attend.

The annual vigil, which normally occurs on the first Monday in October to announce Domestic Violence Awareness Month, was rescheduled from October 3 to the 25th due to inclement weather. Shelter and advocacy programs are coordinating with city leaders across Coastal Virginia to memorialize those lost to domestic violence; to support families, friends, and survivors; to raise awareness of shelters and other resources; and to actively work toward safer relationships and communities.

Norfolk Special Crimes Detective Ryan Davis will present the keynote address. Davis is co-located within the Norfolk Family Justice Center, where he provides support to victims of sexual assault and domestic violence as they move through the criminal justice system. Davis has been with Norfolk Police Department since 2013 and has spent the last four years working with the Special Crimes Unit. Davis is also a defensive tactics instructor, a police training officer, and a hostage negotiator.

A survivor testimony will be presented by Shaneya Jackson who will share the story of her daughter, Raegan Sharnae Chisley, and provide information on the education foundation established in her memory. A powerful display of Silent Witnesses representing fatal victims will also be present.

"People who are experiencing abuse often feel alone and underestimate the support that's available if they reach out for help. Each year, we come together as a community to provide comfort to families and friends who have lost someone and to pledge our commitment to helping others who are in danger. We want the community to show up for victims and survivors and send a strong message that domestic violence is everyone's problem, and we can only solve it together," said Larissa Sutherland, Victim Advocate.

This event is organized by Samaritan House, YWCA of South Hampton Roads, Help and Emergency Response, Inc., The Genieve Shelter, Transitions Family Violence Services, the Norfolk Family Justice Center along with support from Military Family Advocacy Programs and multi-city Victim-Witness programs.
