VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ARE TO BE REMEMBERED AT TWO CANDLELIGHT VIGILS ON "NATIONAL DAY OF UNITY NIGHT OF REMEMBRANCE" ON OCTOBER 2.

HAMPTON ROADS, VA – Coastal Virginia's agencies and non-profits working to prevent domestic violence and support survivors are coming together to host two simultaneous candlelight vigils on Monday, October 2 on the Peninsula in Hampton and on the Southside at downtown Norfolk Slover Library to commemorate the 42nd Annual "National Day of Unity Night of Remembrance," founded by the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence. The vigil is held each year on the first Monday in October, marking the beginning of Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

"Domestic violence is dangerous for everyone, but there are incredibly dedicated people in our community who can help. We hope someone who needs us will find us and reach out for support," said Larissa Sutherland, Victim Advocate.

The community is invited to come together to memorialize those lost to domestic violence; to support families, friends, and survivors; to raise awareness of shelters and other resources; and to actively work toward safer relationships and communities.
