## A Perfect Storm is Brewing in Virginia as the Impact of Drastic Cuts to the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) and the Increase in Need Puts Victims in Hampton Roads at Risk

- Virginia's victim service agencies have suffered a 47.5% overall cut to VOCA.
- At the same time, there was an unprecedented increase in victims needing services. The rise in volume and complexity of victim service requests has strained local resources and further cuts will force agencies to set waiting lists and lay off crucial staff.
- These funds are projected to be fully depleted by fiscal year 2025 and will result in deep cuts to life-saving victim services in Hampton Roads this year.
- The H.E.R. Sheler, Samaritan House, Transitions Family Violence Services, and the YWCA of South Hampton Roads will be negatively impacted by these cuts starting in July, and services will be reduced to victims in the cities of Chesapeake, Hampton, Newport News, Norfolk, Portsmouth, and Virginia Beach.
- If leaders in Richmond don't act now, victims of domestic and sexual assault, human trafficking, child sexual assault, and other violent crimes will suffer.

The purpose of this news conference is to discuss how cuts to Virginia's funding from the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) and discretionary Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) funding will harm the safety net for victims in all of Hampton Roads and put them at risk.
