Best known for her riveting performance as "Eva" in the hit movie, Freedom Writers, starring alongside Hilary Swank, April Hernandez Castillo was living the Hollywood dream. She starred on tv shows such as Person of Interest, Law & Order: SVU, Dexter, and New Amsterdam to name a few. However, behind the glitz and glamor was a woman dealing secretly with a traumatic past.

April's inspirational story of resilience, overcoming adversity, and choosing to move forward no matter what happens in life is a message that resonates with audiences across the globe. In her keynote titled Moving Forward, April intimately describes how she was able to take all her tragedies and turn them into triumphs by choosing to never give up. From growing up in the tough streets of the Bronx during the Crack Epidemic Era, to being in an abusive relationship as a teenager, to almost taking her own life, April truly understands what it feels like when the odds are up against you.

"My life dramatically changed when I made two critical decisions during my abuse. I made a choice to leave and I made a choice to live."

Understanding her platform as an actor and speaker has allowed April to grace an array of audiences. Her message has reached thousands of students and conferences nationwide and internationally. April is also an author and has released her memoir, *Embracing Me*.

Community Impact Award

Brooke Briggs was the Major Gifts Officer at Samaritan House and was instrumental in the creation of the WAV Luncheon and many other successful fundraising efforts.

Brooke's sincere desire to help the community around her was an inspiration to those who knew her and was a 'friend to all.'

Brooke suffered from a heart condition that resulted in her being the 300th heart transplant recipient at Sentara Heart Hospital in May 2010. Brooke went on to live with a renewed sense of compassion and service until she

sadly experienced heart complications that took her life on August 31, 2016. Samaritan House wishes to honor Brooke and continue her legacy with the Brooke Briggs Community Impact Award, that recognizes individuals each year for their significant contributions to the Samaritan House mission.

Kaylie was invited by a longtime Samaritan House supporter to develop a fundraising tennis tournament. In 2014 she began working with Brooke Briggs on what became Serve Love Heal. This led to 6 years of service on the Governing Board, but mostly exposure to just about every aspect of volunteer connection to the agency. Kaylie has worked tables at art fairs,

cleaned toilets in shelters, posted our messages on social media, hosted viewing events and wine tastings, recruited other supporters, packed move-in kits for clients gaining permanent housing, held candles at vigils, and sold drinks at a Bayou festival. And every time, she says, she has learned more about the importance of the agency, its incredibly dedicated staff, and the value of engagement.

Michelle Goodove

Michelle has dedicated much of her life to public service and community involvement. After a successful career in the cities of Virginia Beach and Norfolk, she retired in 1999 to focus on raising her two daughters. Her extensive volunteer work includes nearly two decades on the PTA board and roles as a room mom, dance mom, soccer mom, basketball mom, and swim team representative. Michelle's passion for advocacy led her to become a Court Appointed



Special Advocate (CASA) and currently serves as a Docent with the Virginia Beach Court System. Since March 2023, she has also been actively working in the Donations Department at Samaritan House and helping to organize events such as the Step into the Light Gala.

With proceeds from last year's WAV luncheon:

- Samaritan House was able to assist an additional 36 families in emergency shelter.
- Our victim advocates assisted an additional 126 clients with safety planning and navigating the court system.
- 67 new families found their permanent home.
- 45 families enjoyed a holiday meal and gifts under their tree.


The Hallow

Shelter for trafficked youth

Samaritan House recognized a need for an extended stay, licensed, and secure residential facility in Hampton Roads, and began a capital campaign in 2020 to build "The Hallow." Ground was broken in January 2022 for the group home in Virginia Beach that can house up to eight girls, from ages 11-17 where Samaritan House will provide supervision, care, and a wide variety of programs to help them heal.
